

Some ideas to get you started with your Internationalisation

in general:

- Yes, planning a stay abroad requires a lot of work and figuring things out on your own; however, there is a support system for you: talk to us, talk to the International Office, talk to other students that have already done it - it will all be worth it in the end and it is a great opportunity for you to test your (very much needed in your profession) organisation skills
- One of the main things to do before travelling is **figure out the financial situation**; here, we have put together some **funding opportunities** for you to consider that have worked for other students you can, of course, also do your own research:)

Erasmus(+) (for EU- stays/internships)	 Erasmus mobility can fund either your semester abroad (5-6 months or a year) or your internship (min. 60 days) Usually, you go through an application process coordinated by Dr. Carolin Zehne For university stays: we have specific cooperations with universities, but you are also free to explore other options on your own the internship is definitely found and coordinated by you, but you have support by the international office (Anna Rusche, erasmus-praktikum@uni-bielefeld.de) All you need to know in great detail: https://www.uni-bielefeld.de/international/go-out/downloads/
DAAD/PROMOS	 Similar to Erasmus, PROMOS also funds either your uni stay abroad (3-6 months) or your internship (6 weeks to 6 months) and it is meant for all OTHER countries not covered by Erasmus (outside the EU) There are usually two application phases, one in November and one in May All you need to know: https://www.uni-bielefeld.de/international/go-out/stipendien/
Auslandsbafög	 □ For all students, not only those who get Bafög in Germany □ As with "normal" Bafög, the financial situation of the student (and their family) plays a role in the application process □ Similar to the other two, here again, most stays (unisemester, internship, school work etc.) can be funded □ All you need to know: ⊕ AuslandsBAföG - die tolle Finanzierung von Vater Staat
AIESEC	 □ AIESEC is an international organisation that will help you find and plan your study abroad □ It is rather based on the expertise of the student community and you need to become a member yourself (and a volunteer) □ For Bielefeld, all you need to know: ⊕ AIESEC in Bielefeld Unsere Standorte
ISEP	 ISEP is the best funding programme if you are planning to go (study) in the USA Our department's coordinator for ISEP is Dr. Julia Andres; contact her to give you a great overview of your possibilities

Other ideas	 □ DAAD offers their own scholarships too, you just need to plan a bit more ahead of time, because their deadlines are different; all scholarships here: ⊕ Stipendien finden und bewerben - DAAD - Deutscher □ Teilstipendium des Rektorats - usually to help you write your thesis abroad; look for the deadlines here: ⊕ Scholarships □ Here is another database with scholarships; this helps if you have something specific in mind, for example, looking for scholarship to go to Japan, or for a specific topic: ⊕ Suchmaschinen für Stipendien
