In Kyrgyzstan, E-justice (i.e., ICT tools in courts) is being implemented to improve access to justice, transparency, fair trial and efficiency. This talk focuses on the impact and challenges of using digital tools to improve access to justice for women victims of gender-based violence.

The talk will analyze approaches to the development of digital tools to address gender-based violence and national legislation. The study provides recommendations for improving e-Justice systems, national legislation and awareness raising to enhance access to justice for women victims of gender-based violence.

Dr. Aliia Maralbaeva is an Associate Professor of Law at Ala-Too International University (Kyrgyzstan). She served as the World Bank Consultant on Justice and Digital Transformation (2023-2024). Between 2020 and 2023, she has been Postdoctoral Fellow in the Postdoctoral Fellowship Program "Institutional Change and Social Practice. Research on the Political System, the Economy and Society in Central Asia and the Caucasus" in cooperation with Bielefeld University supported by Volkswagen Foundation (Germany). Her research is focused on e-justice development in Kyrgyzstan and other Asian countries.
